## Word Search Vocabulary

We use the word search puzzle in the newspaper as a vocabulary activity. To start, I call on a child to read the words out loud. We then figure out together what each word means. We make up sentences, give definitions, synonyms and antonyms. We continue doing so until we've gone over all of the words. Children cannot start the word search puzzle until we've gone over every word. I have to admit that sometimes I haven't known a word and we've all had to go to the computer ([www.dictionary.com](http://www.dictionary.com)) and look up the word. But then children get to see how to use an online dictionary.
